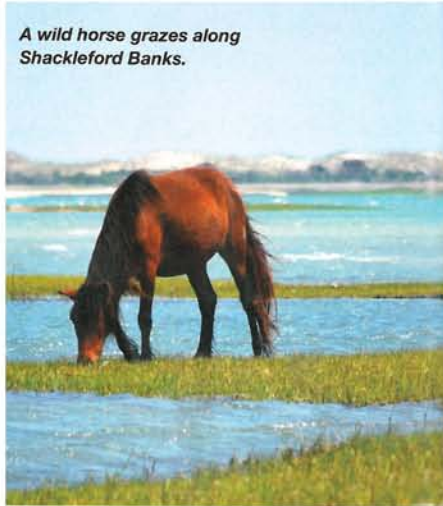

Custom sportfish boatbuilder Jarrett Bay Boatworks has been located in Beaufort, North Carolina, since 1986. They've built over 85 custom sportfishing boats and serviced tens of thousands of vessels. Like many North Carolina builders, Jarrett Bay traces its roots to the charter fishing industry. The company's founders, as well as others now associated with the corporation, were charter fishermen who spent years honing their skills and knowledge in the cockpit and at the helm.



Perhaps best known for their boats' legendary "Carolina" ride, Jarrett Bay constructs boats up to 120 feet, all custom built to the owner's needs and taste. "Most places aren't custom, but A or B," explains Tate Lawrence, New Construction Supervisor at Jarrett Bay. "Whatever you can dream up, we can build up.
